# Scaffolding job demo at the Oil and Gas Job Fair draws public interest



Zaidi briefs observers on scaffolding during demo

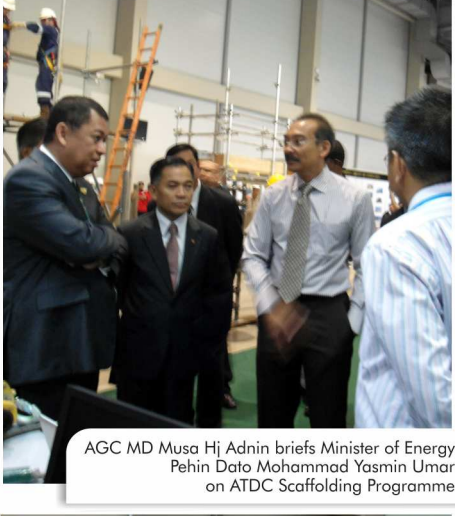
Job seekers took a break from distributing their resumes to their possible employers to watch the scaffolding demonstration at the Bridex Exhibition Hall during the Oil and Gas Job Fair last 13-17 December 2011.

ATDC Sdn Bhd (Adinin Training and Development Centre) was among the contractors who headed the scaffolding demo. "This is our way of informing everyone, especially the Bruneians, that scaffolding is an interesting career. Like any other job, it requires hardwork but it's in demand in Brunei and it pays well," ATDC Manager, Dr. Jess Ravalo, explained. While the job requires being under the sun most of the time, lifting heavy tubes and going offshore, a scaffolder can be promoted as an Scaffolding Inspector and earn at least B\$1,500 with the right training and experience.

The ATDC Scaffolding Team during the job fair includes ATDC's Bruneian Internal Verifier/Scaffolding Instructor Zaidi bin Tarmidi and Assessor Ainol Rizal Bin Md Radin and two scaffolders from Adinin Works and Engineering who were trained under the ATDC's Youth Employment Programme.

"Scaffolding is a viable career path", Zaidi bin Tarmidi said while sharing how he started as a scaffolder as well and at present, he's the only certified Bruneian Internal Verifier. "Most of the scaffolders in Brunei are foreigners and it's high time for our locals to consider having a career in this area so Bruneians will be known as scaffolding experts as well," Mr. Tarmidi added.

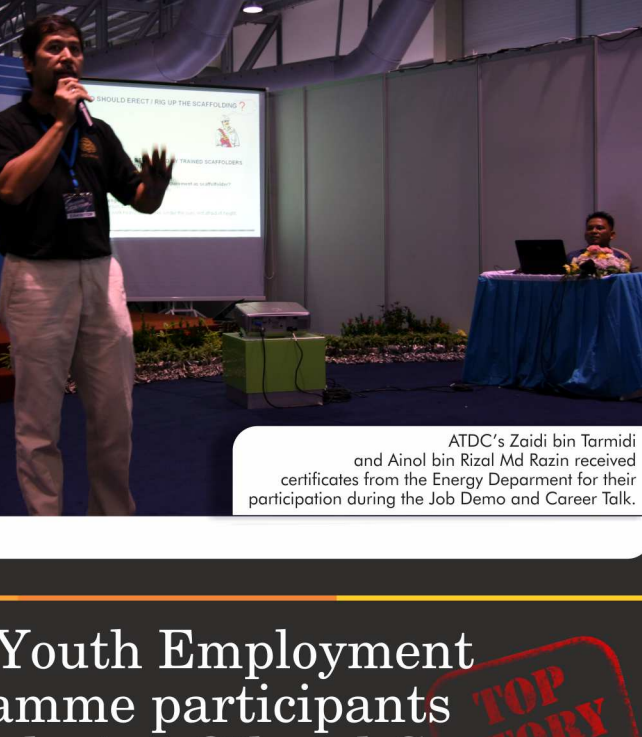
Apart from the career talk, Mr. Tarmidi also briefed observers on scaffolding during the job demo.

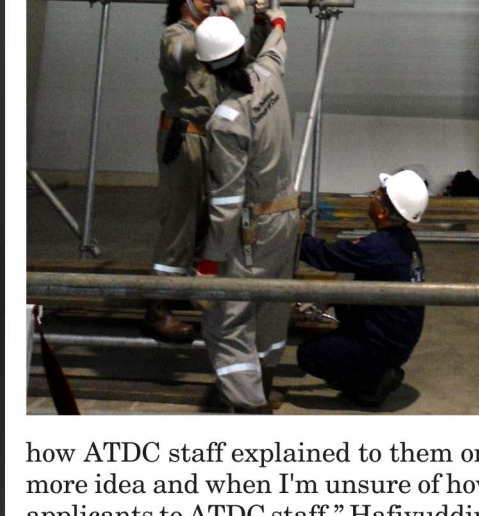

# ATDC Youth Employment Programme participants step up during Oil and Gas Job Fair



ATDC invited Youth Employment Programme participants Mohamad Hafiyuddin Bin Hj. Mohamad Hassanal Mega and Mohammed Faliq Haqim Bin Mohamad Joini to the Oil and Gas Job Fair as part of the Scaffolding Job Demo team.

The two youth, who finished Basic Scaffolding Training and NVQ Level 1 Assessment at ATDC, worked on putting up and dismantling scaffold during the job demo at the Oil and Gas Job Fair in Bridex International Conference Centre last 13-17 December 2011.



"They were nervous on the first day because there were a lot of people watching them as they put up the scaffold but on the following days, they were confident already," Ainol Rizal, ATDC assessor shared.

The two are now employed under Adinin Works and Engineering and are based in BLNG. They started out without any skills on scaffolding but after finishing the 10-day training at ATDC and CSKILL's NVQ assessment, they became qualified to work at AWE, one of the premier companies in the country.

During the job fair, they were not only involved in the job demo but they also assisted ATDC in inviting applicants to register for ATDC's Youth Employment Programme.

"At first I don't know what to tell the applicants but after I listened to how ATDC staff explained to them on scaffolding, I got more idea and when I'm unsure of how to answer their questions, I pass the applicants to ATDC staff," Hafiyuddin said as he described his experience in inviting applicants to join the Youth Employment Programme.

"They are actually the perfect 'recruiter' for the programme since they can share their experience and how far they've gone after finishing the training at ATDC," Dr. Jess Ravalo said as he lauded the two youth's involvement during the job fair.

The third batch of ATDC Youth Employment Programme will start in February 2012 and with the interest shown by government departments, more local youth will surely benefit from the Programme.
